Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. Mandatory Condition

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

2. Mandatory Condition

The responsible person shall ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. Mandatory Condition

1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

4. Mandatory Condition

The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

5. Mandatory Condition

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

6. Mandatory Condition

(1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

7. Mandatory Condition

Admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the film classification body specified in the licence, or, where the licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that it considers a classification is necessary then, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

In this section -

"children" means persons under the age of 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

8. Mandatory Condition

Where this licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority, with the following exceptions:

a) premises where the premises licence authorises plays or films

b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (premises being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or

c) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

9. Subject to the following exceptions, no person shall except during the permitted hours listed above, sell or supply alcohol for consumption on or off the premises or consume in or take from the premises any alcohol. The exceptions are:

- i. The consumption of alcohol
 - a. during the first twenty minutes after the permitted hours
 - b. during the first thirty minutes after the permitted hours by persons taking meals on the premises provided that the alcohol is provided as ancillary to the meals.
- ii. The taking of alcohol from the premises during the first twenty minutes after the permitted hours provided it is not supplied or taken in an open container.
- iii. The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered.
- iv. The sale or supply of alcohol to, or its consumption by, any person residing in the licensed premises.
- v. The taking of alcohol from the licensed premises by a person residing there.
- vi. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by such person at that persons own expense and consumption by those friends of alcohol so supplied.
- vii. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to person's employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- viii. The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club.

10. Event days

- a. No more than 12 extensions per year (excluding applications made under TENS (temporary event notices) are allowed to extend your supply of alcohol hours until 02:00 am the next day at your discretion.
- b. An operating plan covering the additional measures that will be taken to manage crime and disorder on these occasions is to be completed before the event takes place
- c. A minimum of 7 days notice will be given to the Police and Licensing Authority for all events where the selling of alcohol for that event will take place for longer than your licence normally allows
- d. The police reserve the right to veto any of these events.

11. No admission or re-admission into the premises after 12:00am midnight on Fridays and Saturdays

12. When Queens Park Rangers play at home alcohol will not be sold before 11:00 hours.

13. On days when Queens Park Rangers Football Club are playing at home the premises will not use glass or glass bottles for three hours before the advertised kick off time until three hours after the match has been completed.

14. The DPS must attend regular Pub Watch meetings in his area as organised by the local authority town centre managers.

15. The provision of hot drinks and snacks to be made available particularly during the 30 minute wind down period between the sale of alcohol and closing time.

16. Live music WILL CEASE 30 minutes before the pub closing time on each respective night. The DPS for the premises is to regularly monitor noise levels within the pub to ensure that no noise nuisance affects local residents.

17. The outside area is NOT to be used after 11:00 pm.

18. A MAXIMUM of two performers with acoustic, amplified music and or voice, karaoke with microphone and screens is permitted on the premises. Performances to end 30 minutes before the closing time of the premises

19. Spontaneous dancing with live/recorded music

a. Is to end 30 minutes before closing time of the premises.

b. and only to take place a maximum of three times a week at the discretion of the designated premises supervisor.

20. Under 18 year olds MUST NOT be on the premises whether accompanied by an adult or not by 1900 hours, Monday to Sunday.

21. During the exhibition of a film, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the film classification body specified in the licence.

22. Appropriate signage will be displayed in a prominent position, informing customers they are being recorded on CCTV.

23. CCTV covering areas inside and outside of the premises should be installed and maintained to police recommendations with properly maintained log arrangements. All images will be stored for a minimum of 31 days.

24. CCTV is to comply with the Data Protection Act 1998 and is to be working and recording correctly when the premises are open to the public. If the CCTV is not working then the premises will comply with requests by the police, including suspension of licensable activity.

25. A staff member from the premises that is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system will be on the premises at all times that the premises are open to the public. This staff member will be able to show police recent data footage with the minimum of delay when requested. This data or footage reproduction should be almost instantaneous.

26. A refusals book shall be kept at the premises to record details of all refusals to sell alcohol. This book shall contain the date and time of the incident, a description of the customer, the name of the staff member who refused the sale, and the reason the sale was refused. The book shall be made available to Police and authorised Council officers on request.

27. The Designated Premises Supervisor shall regularly check the refusals book to ensure it is being consistently used by all staff.

28. A Proof of Age scheme shall operate at the premises and all staff shall be trained in its implementation. Only photographic ID such as a British driving licence or a passport shall be treated as acceptable forms of identification.

29. The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that all existing staff, supervisors and managers receive an induction in the legality and procedure of alcohol sales, prior to undertaking the sale of alcohol. This training will include the contents of the premises licence; times of operation, licensable activities and all conditions. Training documents shall be signed and dated, and training records be made available to a police officer or council officer on request. The records will be retained for at least 18 months.

30. When door supervisors are on duty 'clickers' or other recognised counting devices will be used. An accurate log of patron numbers will be maintained by door supervisors.

31. All door supervisors will be provided with a hand held radio which allows communication between all members of the door supervisor team and the premises manager.

32. Policy and procedures for door staff will be put into place around dispersal techniques for customers and procedures for dealing with incidents that occur in or around the vicinity of the premises. These will be provided to the police upon request.

33. A copy of the premises licence will be provided to any company involved in the provision of security services at the premises.

34. All staff shall be trained in how to manage a crime scene and crime scene preservation. This training shall be repeated at least once a year and written records of training kept on the premises and made available to Police and authorised Council Officers on request.

35. On days when Queens Park Rangers are playing at home there will be one personal licence holder on duty from three hours before the advertised kick off until three hours after the match has been completed.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

36. On days when Queens Park Rangers Football Club play at home the premises will have two SIA registered door staff on duty for three hours before the advertised kick off time until three hours after the match has been completed.

37. On days when Queens Park Rangers Football Club play at home the premises will not allow any outside drinking to the front of the premises for three hours before the advertised kick off time until three hours after the match has been completed.
